1. The nurse is able to address health-related problems utilizing the nursing process and Scope and Standards of Camp Nursing Practice.
2. The nurse is able to set up a medication administration system based on a specific camp setting.
3. The nurse is able to list management strategies of at least three common illnesses or injuries experienced at camp.
4. The nurse is able to discuss key collaborators in a camp setting and at least two situations when the nurse needs to initiate a collaborative relationship.
5. The nurse is able to differentiate normal maturational stressors from common mental health conditions.
