27. Discuss nursing care or clients who have been victims of abuse and violence
28. Discuss risk factors and characteristics of mood disorder
29. Discuss the nursing role of dealing with a chemically impaired professional
30. Discuss the role of physical health/illness and biologic makeup that can influence a client's emotional response
31. Discuss theories of depression and bipolar disorder
32. Discuss traditional, residential, and community treatment settings and services
33. Discuss treatment issues related to mental illness for the homeless and in the criminal justice system
34. Distinguish between delirium and dementia in regards to signs, symptoms, and treatments
35. Explain basic beliefs and approaches of different psychosocial theories`
36. Explain nursing roles such as information giver, caregiver, advocate, and surrogate in the nurse-client relationship
37. Explain the importance of attitudes, beliefs, empathy, trust and values, in the development of nurse client relationship
38. Explain trends in substance abuse and programs for prevention
