5. Student will gain the skills needed to print well-crafted fiber-based silver gelatin prints, including effectively operating enlargers, chemistry, burning and dodging.
6. Student will have a working knowledge of how to operate in a traditional wet-darkroom.
7. Student will have basic knowledge of matting and framing.
